The Holy Communion

All seeking God are welcome at Christ's Table. Communion is currently being offered in one kind—the full grace of the sacrament is received with only the bread.

For those worshipping in person, please follow the directions of the Ushers. Consecrated hosts are distributed by priests at standing stations. Please exit your pew toward the side aisle. Before receiving Communion, please sanitize your hands. The priest will place the host in your outstretched palm. If you prefer a gluten-free host, simply ask the priest for one at the time of Communion.

We are using the Expansive Language version of the Eucharistic Prayer that was approved for trial use at General Convention 2018. Therefore, some of the words you hear the Presider praying may be different than what is in the Book of Common Prayer.


