
Reader A reading from the Revelation to John.

THE GOSPEL John 11:32-44

When Mary came where Jesus was and saw him, she knelt at his feet and said to him, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died." When Jesus saw her weeping, and the Jews who came with her also weeping, he was greatly disturbed in spirit and deeply moved. He said, "Where have you laid him?" They said to him, "Lord, come and see." Jesus began to weep. So the Jews said, "See how he loved him!" But some of them said, "Could not he who opened the eyes of the blind man have kept this man from dying?"

Then Jesus, again greatly disturbed, came to the tomb. It was a cave, and a stone was lying against it. Jesus said, "Take away the stone." Martha, the sister of the dead man, said to him, "Lord, already there is a stench because he has been dead four days." I knew that you always hear me, but I have said this for the sake of the crowd standing here, so that they may believe that you sent me." Celebrant	Do you desire to be baptized?

When all have been presented the Celebrant asks the parents and godparents

Will you be responsible for seeing that the children you present are brought up in the Christian faith and life?

Parents and Godparents I will, with God's help.

Celebrant

Will you by your prayers and witness help these children to grow into the full stature of Christ?

Parents and Godparents I will, with God's help.

Then the Celebrant asks the following questions of the candidates who can speak for themselves, and of the parents and godparents.

Question	Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?
Answer	I renounce them.
Question Answer	Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God? I renounce them.

Question Answer	Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God? I renounce them.
Question	Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Savior?
Answer	I do.
Question	Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?
Answer	I do.
Question	Do you promise to follow and obey him as your Lord?
Answer	I do.

After all have been presented, the Celebrant addresses the congregation, saying

Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support these persons in their life in Christ?

People We will.

The Celebrant then says these or similar words

Let us join with those who are committing themselves to Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant.

Celebrant	Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?
People	I will, with God's help.
Celebrant	Will you persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?
People	I will, with God's help.
Celebrant	Will you proclaim by word and by example the Good News of God in Christ?
People	I will, with God's help.
Celebrant	Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor as yourself?
People	I will, with God's help.
Celebrant	Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?
People	I will, with God's help.

With the cross leading, the baptismal party processes to the font, followed by the congregation singing...

Wade in the water, wade in the water, children, Wade in the water, God's gonna trouble the water.

Prayers for the Candidates

The Celebrant then says this to the congregation

Let us now pray for these persons who are to receive the Sacrament of new birth.

A person appointed leads the following petitions

Leader People	Deliver them, O Lord, from the way of sin and death. Lord, hear our prayer.
Leader People	Open their hearts to your grace and truth. Lord, hear our prayer.
Leader People	Fill them with your holy and life-giving Spirit. Lord, hear our prayer.
Leader People	Keep them in the faith and communion of your holy Church. Lord, hear our prayer.
Leader People	Teach them to love others in the power of the Spirit. Lord, hear our prayer.
Leader People	Send them into the world in witness to your love. Lord, hear our prayer.
Leader People	Bring them to the fullness of your peace and glory. Lord, hear our prayer.

The Celebrant says

Grant, O Lord, that all who are baptized into the death of Jesus Christ your Son may live in the power of his resurrection and look for him to come again in glory; who lives and reigns now and forever. **Amen.**

Thanksgiving over the Water

The Celebrant blesses the water, first saying

PeopleThe Lord be with you.And also with you.

CelebrantLet us give thanks to the Lord our God.PeopleIt is right to give him thanks and praise.

Celebrant

We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through it you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In it your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

At the following words the Celebrant touches the water

Now sanctify this water, we pray you, by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who here are cleansed from sin and born again may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior.

To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and for ever. Amen

The Baptism

Each candidate is presented by name to the Celebrant, or to an assisting priest or deacon, who then immerses, or pours water upon, the candidate, saying

Delilah Elizabeth, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

Graham Isaiah, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

Sybil Renee, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. **Amen.**

Then the Bishop or Priest places a hand on the person's head, marking on the forehead the sign of the cross [using Chrism if desired] and saying to each one

Delilah Elizabeth, you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever. **Amen.**

Graham Isaiah, you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever. **Amen.**

Sybil Renee, you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in Baptism and marked as Christ's own for ever. **Amen.**

When this action has been completed for all candidates, the Bishop or Priest, at a place in full sight of the congregation, prays over them, saying

Let us pray.

Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon these your servants the forgiveness of sin, and have raised them to the new life of grace. Sustain them, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give them an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. **Amen.**

Candles representing the light of Christ in the newly baptized lives are lit from the paschal candle and provided to the newly baptized.

When all have been baptized, the Celebrant says Let us welcome the newly baptized.




The Holy Communion

The people remain standing. The Presider, whether bishop or priest, faces them and sings




Then, facing the Holy Table, the Celebrant proceeds

Then the Celebrant continues


O God, you are holy and gracious: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, our Rock and our Foundation.

Jesus stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself, in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

At the following words concerning the bread, the Celebrant is to hold it, or to lay a hand upon it; and at the words concerning the cup, to hold or place a hand upon the cup and any other vessel containing wine to be consecrated.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, Jesus took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper, Jesus took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: this is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."



The Celebrant continues

We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, Most Holy God, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Recalling Christ's death, resurrection, and ascension, we offer you these gifts. Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in Christ. Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal Reign.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory are yours, Most Blessed One, now and forever. **AMEN.**



The Body of Christ, the bread of heaven. [*Amen.*] The Blood of Christ, the cup of salvation. [*Amen.*]

The Holy Communion

All seeking God are welcome at Christ's Table. Communion is currently being offered in both kinds in stations.

For those worshiping in person, please follow the directions of the Ushers. Consecrated hosts are distributed by priests at standing stations. Please exit your pew via the center aisle. Hand sanitizer is available at the aisle end of each of the pews if you wish to use it. If you prefer a gluten-free host, simply ask the priest for one at the time of Communion.

Wine will be offered by the chalice bearer closer to the side aisle. You may do one of three options: take directly by mouth from the chalice (not intinction), simply stop in front of the chalice bearer and receive the words of administration, or clearly bypass the chalice bearer if you prefer neither of the above.

A WORD ABOUT TODAY'S KEYBOARD SOLOS...

The prelude and postlude for this All Saint's are heartfelt memorials to master musicians who died too early. "Goodbye Porkpie Hat" remembers Lester Young, famous for his beautiful smooth saxophone sound, as well as being a snappy dresser (always including a porkpie hat), who died at age 49. His friend, composer, bassist, band leader and mailman Charles Mingus was a towering figure in 20th century music. The *Fugue On the Name* "*Alain*" remembers Jehan Alain, who died defending France against Nazi invasion at age 29. He was already one of the most important organ composers in the world. His friend Maurice Duruflé invented a system of mapping each letter of the alphabet to a musical note, and the melody you hear throughout the piece spells out A-L-A-I-N.
